Chairman's Report



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2016 PROGRAMS & INITIATIVES

NSWACT Alpine Teams

In 2016 NSW Alpine and ACT Alpine combined again to announce NSWACT Open, Junior and Children's teams, thereby recognizing alpine athletes who are performing at high level in the sport and meet published criteria for inclusion in the state teams. Team lists are attached.

In 2016:

Open	5	(2 female and 3 male athletes)
Junior (FIS)	13	(6 female and 7 male athletes)
Children's	19	(10 female and 10 male athletes)

In 2017:

Open	7	(4 female and 3 male athletes)
Junior (FIS)	6	(1 female and 5 male athletes)
Children's	27	(13 female and 14 male athletes)

A presentation night was held on the 2nd of July at the Candlelight Lodge Thredbo to acknowledge the 2016 team and present Team Certificates to all team members. The new subsidised Team Vest was also distributed to those that ordered them. The Team Vest will be available again this year to 2017 Team members who will be contacted early in 2017 to place their order for the 2017 season. We would like to thank John and Megan Leggett for their support in arranging this highly successful evening.

NSWACT Team Athlete Grants will be provided to qualifying alpine athletes aged 14 years and above. These grants are to assist in meeting training, race entry and travelling costs. Applications are now open and close November 1st, 2016.

Lillehammer 2016 Winter Youth Olympics

Two member of the NSWACT Alpine Team were pre-selected for nomination for the Winter Youth Olympics. - Jack Adams and Zali Offord. While the final single alpine spots went to Louis Muhlen and Kathryn Parker, Zali went on to represent Australia as part of the successful Skier cross Team, bringing home a Silver medal.

Race season results

There were some outstanding performances by NSWACT Alpine athletes at this year's FIS races in Perisher, the Australian National Junior Championships held at Thredbo in early August and the Australian New Zealand Cup series held at Mt Hotham, including a comeback by ski veteran Jenny Owens.

First races for the season kicked off in Perisher. Slalom had to be cancelled however was replaced with a second day of GS. First year FIS athlete Madison Hoffman scored an impressive 1st and 2nd in the GS races. Zali Offord was 1st Day 1, though DNF'd Day 2, and Lily Tomkinson podiumed both days with a 2nd and 3rd.

In the Men on Day 1, best performing NSWACT athlete was Liam Michael with a 4th. Liam also led the NSW field on Day 2 with another 4th, with Theo Coates close on his tail with a close 5th. Ned Neill was Top 10 on both days.

Next was the National GS Alpine Championships in Thredbo. Day 1 was the National Championship race, followed by the NJR on Day 2. TSRC athlete Lily Tomkinson won on both days, with Jenny Owens 2nd Day 1 and 3rd Day 2. Madison Hoffman had another great result with 3rd Day 1 and 2nd Day 2. Overall results for the women were U18 Junior Champion Madison Hoffman, Georgia Vonenem 2nd and Zoe Scott 3rd. U21 Junior Champion was Lily Tomkinson, Zoe Spanos was runner up Overall Women winners were Lily Tomkinson 1st and Jenny Owens 2nd.

In the Men's, Day1 was won by US skier Thomas Woolson with Harrison Coull 2nd and TSRC athlete Oliver. Thompson 3rd. Day 2 winners were Harry Laidlaw 1st, Michelangelo Tentori 2nd and Peter Fucigna 3rd. U18 Champion was Hunter Brayton 1st, TSRC athlete Liam Michael in 2nd and Rupert Pichler 3rd. Overall Junior winners were Harrison Coull 1st and TSRC athlete Oliver Thompson 2nd.

In the National Slalom Championships Lily Tomkinson again took out the title, with Zali Offord 2nd. In the men's TSRC athlete Bennett Norbury had outstanding results taking out the National Title, with Warwick Crawford taking out the Junior Men. PWSC athlete Theo Coates was runner up.

At the ANC in Mt Hotham, Greta Small was the standout placing 2nd in both GS and slalom. NSWACT athletes Zana Farrell, Zali Offord, Madison Hoffman and Lily Tomkinson, all achieved Top 10 in the GS events with 1st year FIS Madison Hoffman and Lucy Neill performing well in the Slalom. Alec Scott and Oliver Thompson had the best results in the Men's events.

Special mention to Zanna Farrell and Jenny Owens who both achieved Top 10 results in the FIS races held at Treble Cone, NZ.

In Children's racing this year –

4-5 March 2016 saw several NSWACT athletes represent Australia in the 55th Trofeo Topolino race held at Folgaria, Italy. Athletes included Madison Hoffman, Samantha Marwood, Lara Agnew (34th U14 Slalom), Isabella Davies (37th U14 Slalom), Thomas Hoffman (8th U14 Slalom & 16th GS), Jasper Cobcroft (40th U14 GS), Henry Heaydon (27th U16 Slalom & 34th GS), Zach Zontsich (30th U14 GS and 24th SL), Connor Leggett (45th U16 Slalom & 43rd GS), and Finn Bowes (51st U16 GS). Topolino is an extremely competitive race so congratulations to all our athletes.

A team of NSWACT athletes also competed at the Whistler Cup in April. Two state teams competed with some excellent performances that included Georgia Von Einem 11th in U16 SG with Sammie Gaul 18th, Lucy Neill 21st. Finn Bowes was 5th Men's U16 SG. Amelia Jones, Zoe Michael and Kyra Wheatley were all top 30 in the U14 GS, while in the U16 Georgia Von Einem placed 7th, Sammie Gaul 11th. In the U16 Slalom the top placing girls were Lucy Neill 15th and Sammie Gaul 21st. Hugh McAdam had the best NSW result in the U16 GS placing 26th. Congratulations to all NSW athletes who competed in this event representing Australia, NSW and ACT.

Mt Hotham hosted Leg 1 of the National Children's Series in August. NSWACT team members dominated all events.

SX – U14 Kyra Wheatley 1st, Penelope Hughes 2nd. Boys Ben Wynn 2nd, Felix Zylinski 3rd. In the U16's Lara Agnew 1st, Elliane Hall 2nd, Sammie Gaul 3rd and Alexandra Manning 4th. In the boys Finn Sadler 1st, Thomas Hoffman 3rd, Henry Heaydon 4th.

GS U14 Penelope Hughes 1st in both races, Kyra Wheatley 3rd and 2nd with Letitia Murphy 3rd Race 2. James Huon took out GS in both runs, with Ben Wyn, Joey Stegall & Harry Hoffman battling it out for 2nd and 3rd. Joey Stegall and James Huon were Top 3 in both Slalom races.

GS U16 – Zoe Michael 1st, Sammie Gaul 2nd Race 1 and Zoe 1st and Elliane Hall 3rd in Race 2. Thomas Hoffman & Tom Davies took 2nd & 3rd respectively in Race 1 with Thomas and Zach Zontsich 2nd & 3rd in race 2.

Slalom – Kyra Wheatley & Penelope Hughes were Top 3 in both U14 races, with U16 Sammie Gaul, Lara Agener and Alexandra Manning Top 3 in Race 1 and Zara Gardiner and Adele Selig top 3 in Race 2. In the U16 boys Thomas Hoffman & Zac Zontsich were 2nd & 3rd Race 1 while Henry Heaydon and Thomas were Top 3 in Race 2.

Early September, Leg 2 of the series was moved from Thredbo to Perisher at the last minute due to poor snow conditions. Results include:

U12GS – Phoebe Heaydon won Race 1 & 2 girls, in the boys Race 1 Joel Droga was 2nd, Duncan Cowan 3rd. In Race 2 Joel Droga was 1st, Duncan Cowan 2nd.

U14GS – Penelope Hughes 1st Race 1 & 2, Kyra Wheatley 3rd Race 2, and in the boys James Huon 1st, Joey Stegall 2nd, Ben Wynn 3rd.

U16 GS – Race 1, Zoe Michael 1st, Sammie Gaul 2nd and Adele Zelig 3rd. Race 2 Sammie Gaul, 1st and Isabella Davis 3rd. In the U16 boys Tom Davies 2nd Race 1, in Race 2 Finn Sadler 2nd and Henry Heaydon 3rd.

U12 Slalom girls Race 1 & 2 won by Abbey Davis. In Race 2 Phoebe Heaydon 2nd., Cate Dance 3rd. In the boys Geoffrey Hughes was 2nd, Race 2 was won by Joel Droga with Geoffrey Hughes 3rd.

U14 Slalom – In Race 1 Penelope Hughes 2nd and Kyra Wheatley 3rd were on the podium, Race 2 was won by Penelope. James Huon 1st & Joey Stegall 2nd in both races in the boys

U16 Slalom – Race 1 Sammie Gaul, Zoe Michael & Adele Selig were 1st, 2nd & 3rd. in Race 2 it was Zoe 1st, Sammie 2nd and Adele 3rd. In both races, Henry Heaydon was 1st and Tom Davies 3rd.

The depth of talent amongst the younger athletes is very encouraging – many of the Under 16s will be graduating to FIS next season and it will be exciting to see their development over the coming seasons.

NSWIS Scholarship

In 2016 NSWIS, in conjunction with SSA, awarded an alpine scholarship to an athlete demonstrating the potential to represent Australia at the 2022 Olympic Winter Games in Beijing in 2022. Congratulations to NSWACT athlete Oliver Thompson on being awarded this Scholarship. Unfortunately Oliver has decided to retire from alpine skiing this year. He will be missed on the hill and we wish him luck in the future.

NSWACT Rising Stars Awards

NSWACT Alpine, Perisher Winter Sports Club and Thredbo Ski Racing Club combined again this season to offer this exciting Award to talented Interschool racers without previous race club experience.

In 2016 ten alpine racers from Division 3, 4 or 5 across the Sydney, Northern or Southern/ACT regions were selected for this year's Alpine Rising Stars Awards. They receive a complimentary weekend of training at either TSRC or PWSC and free entry and race club assistance at the Blue Cow Cup on race day.

Congratulations to the following alpine racers: Matteo Perrotta, Samuel Vos and Emily Vos Northern Division 5, Jack Duncan, Winston Kloster, Chloe Kennard, Sydney Division 4, Jack Walker Sydney Division 5, Hamish Allsopp, Hugo Thompson ACT Division 4 and Georgia Gardiner Division 5.

The 2016 Rising Stars will be recognized at tonight's Awards Presentation.

NSW Alpine would like to thank TSRC and PWSC for their assistance and continued support with this program by providing the weekend training for the winners of these awards. The feedback from previous winners has been very positive with the majority of award winners joining a race club the following season and competing in SSA events

Thank you also to NSW Alpine Committee Secretary Kim Hough for her management of this important program again this year.

SERAS

The South Eastern Regional Academy of Sport (SERAS) program is open to NSW and ACT athletes aged 13 to 17 years. It provides two weekend camps each year (May and September) at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra which assists athletes with fitness coaching and testing plus information sessions relating to health, goal setting and sports psychology. It's interesting to note that at the Sochi Olympic Winter Games 2014 seven former SERAS scholarship competed in Snowsport events.

In 2016 there were 4 alpine NSW & ACT athletes who participated in the SERAS program. Applications for 2017 will open in February 2017.

Interschool APSI Scholarship

2016 saw the first time a scholarship was offered by Interschool in conjunction with Australian Professional Snowsport Instructors (APSI). This is in recognition of the rising potential for Snowsport instructors within our schools. The Scholarship recipients will receive a "Level one course and exam package" to attend an APSI level one instructors course in 2017. Congratulations to this year's winners:

Fitness Testing and Training Sessions

Pre-season fitness sessions were held in May in Narrabeen Sport & Rec and June in Jindabyne. These were run by Sami Kennedy-Sims who put together a comprehensive and extremely successful program.

SSA are running a post season weekend session at Narrabeen Sport & Rec on October 29 – 30, 2016. These are compulsory for athletes aiming to compete in the Northern Hemisphere season.

The camps have been well attended with very positive feedback received from athletes and parents as well as requests to consider exam timetables when scheduling for next year.

Alpine Officials Courses

These are the only accredited training course for alpine officials currently being offered in Australia and are always well attended. This year the Alpine Officials Level 1 Course was presented by Scott Sanderson, member of the NAC and Mt Hotham Race Club Program Director. The March course in Sydney was hosted by The Scots College and in June at Jindabyne Central School where there was record attendance. Thanks to both schools for providing the venues for the courses. In 2017 the Sydney venue be The Kings School, then alternating after that each year with The Scots College.

This year as no government grant was attained these courses were underwritten solely by NSW Alpine.

We thank Scott Sanderson for delivering these courses and ensuring that our alpine athletes compete in competently officiated events each season. Thanks also to NSW Alpine Committee Chair John Adams for coordinating these courses.

Member Communication

A vital link in our alpine community and we particularly thank NSW Snowsports Executive Officer Rebecca Clark for her expertise in maintaining the NSW Alpine section of the NSW Snowsports website. In addition regular e-news updates kept our athletes and parents and supporters fully informed throughout and post season.

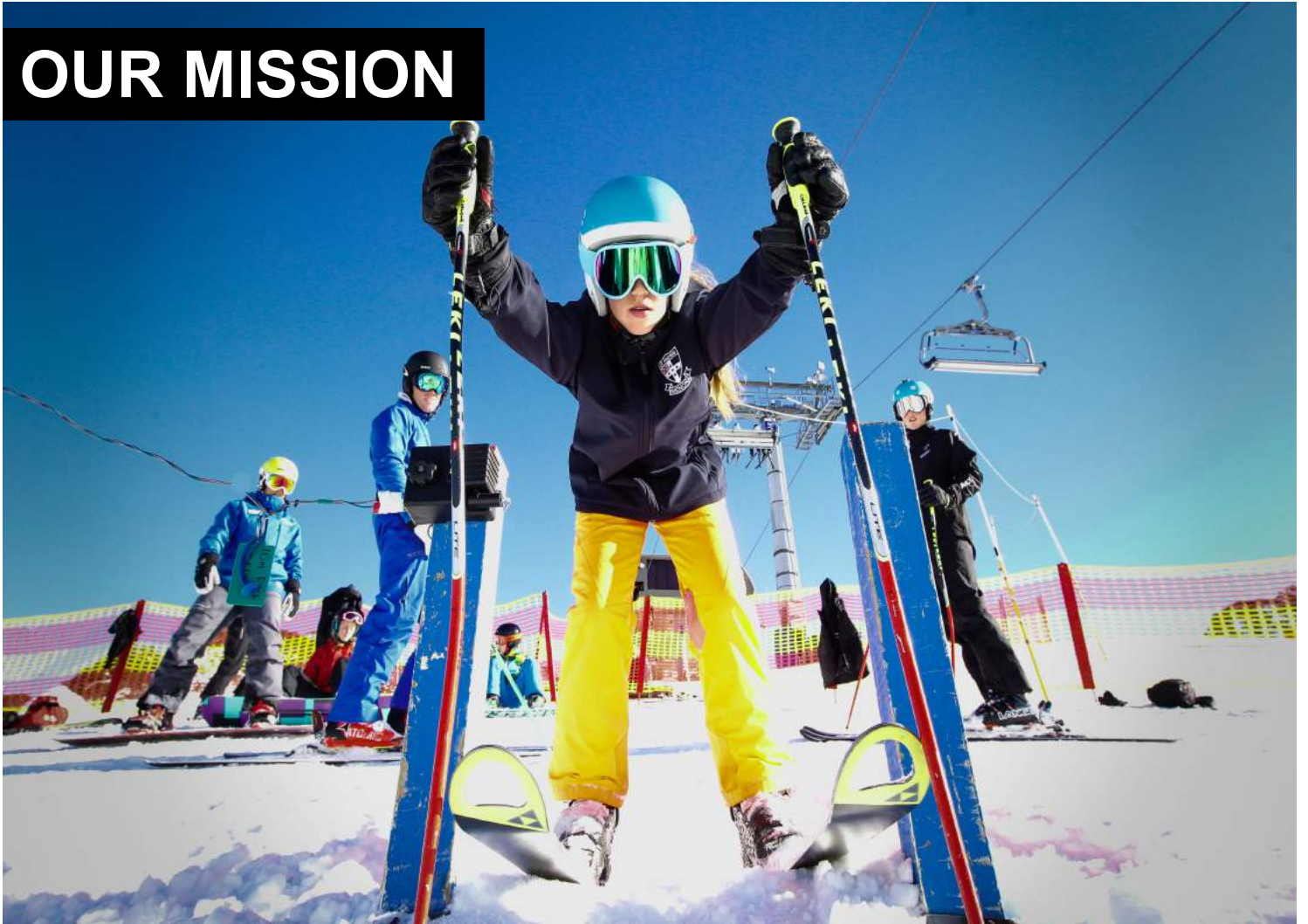

NSW Snowsports is a not for profit organization that is affiliated to and works closely with the National Snowsports body, Ski and Snowboard Australia Ltd (SSA). NSW Alpine has been representing and serving alpine athletes and the sport since 1973, and is represented on the NSW Snowsports board of with two directors.

The subcommittee consists of parents and business professionals who are passionate about snowsports and the advancement of the alpine disciplines in NSW. We work integrally with NSW Snowsports to achieve:

- Increasing broad-based ‘grass roots’ level participation in programs, events, clubs and the world-class Interschools program.
- Talent identification and support programs aiming to facilitate a steady flow of talented athletes moving along the ‘athlete pathways’ to the NSW Institute of Sport and to National and International training and competition level.
- Development of education and support for coaches, instructors, volunteers, official and administrators to ensure the achievement of our vision.
- Focus on gender equity, and encouragement of participation at all levels by members of identified disadvantaged groups.
- Increase the public profile of snowsports as part of a healthy, interesting and diverse lifestyle.

This is underpinned by a sound framework of policies, governance, and compliance.

NSW Alpine have initiated important events and programs designed to promote the sport and enhance athlete development, including :-

- Facilitation of athlete fitness testing.
- Provision of weekly alpine focused fitness clinics between seasons.
- Provision of course official technical education.
- The Rising Stars Program which introduces promising skiers from the Interschools competitions to the advanced race training available at the Thredbo Ski Racing Club and the Perisher Winter Sports Club.
- Community events such as the Thin Air Fun Run.
- Financial support for high performance athletes selected to the NSW State Team.
- Scholarships and awards.
- Facebook and social media.

We would like to do so much more to promote awareness, participation and development of athletes to elite levels.

COMMITMENT



NSW boasts a pool of talented Alpine athletes with the capacity to develop into World Cup and Olympic competitors. However Alpine ski racing is an expensive sport – the financial barriers mean that often even the most talented athletes are unable to reach their potential.

There are significant ongoing financial outlays necessary by athletes and their families for apparel, equipment, on-snow coaching, fitness training, lift passes, club membership and race entries, race licenses, comprehensive overseas travel/competition insurances, athlete supports (fitness clubs, physiotherapy, sports psychology aids), local, interstate and overseas travel.

For example, the typical cost for a junior FIS racer competing in both the southern and northern winters is approximately \$40,000 per year and as athletes progress to higher levels these costs only increase. A high level of dedication, determination and investment is required for a successful athlete to make a podium or be a regular on the World Cup circuit.

A younger aged athlete has a journey of more than 10 years to develop into a mature athlete capable of becoming an international competitor. Even for accomplished competition skiers there are limited financial resources available to that athlete.

There is currently minimal direct funding support available in Alpine ski racing at the sub-elite and elite levels in Australia. Parents and families of provide almost all of the necessary financial support. By example, the Olympic Winter Institute currently operate and fund snowsports programs in Aerial Skiing, Mogul Skiing, Skier-Cross, Snowboard-Cross and Snowboard Halfpipe but not in Alpine.

NSW Alpine aims to make competitive alpine racing available to as wide a range of talented and motivated athletes as possible by supporting their commitment and reducing the barriers.

OUR PROPOSAL

NSW Alpine seeks to strengthen and grow the sport of Alpine Ski Racing in NSW, and as a consequence in Australia. We strive to foster the sense of community, grow the numbers participating, and assist in the development of elite competitors from a grass-roots basis. Developing a solid foundation of fit and skilled junior racers and supporting the direction of the Ski and Snowboard Australia (SSA) broader plans is essential to the future of Alpine Ski Racing in Australia.

Our goal is to overcome the barriers to athlete participation and performance through targeted programs and financial assistance that assists to reduce the cost of training and competition for our promising young athletes.

We would greatly appreciate your support.

In 2016 there were over 18,000 competitors participating across Interschools, SSA and FIS snowsports events, the majority of which were from NSW.
